PREFERENTIAL ACCESS TO ATTRACTIONS

The Park provides a preferential access service to attractions for Guests with particular physical, sensory, cognitive or oncological problems. The possibility of using this service is evaluated exclusively at the Welcome Desk and only after viewing the appropriate disability certification.

PLEASE NOTE! This service does NOT guarantee the holder IMMEDIATE access to the attractions allowed by the security limits, but rather preferential access compared to the normal line, especially on days with a particularly high expected turnout.

The service allows preferential access to the permitted attractions, in addition to the certified Guest, to a maximum of 4 other accompanying persons. One of them must be an able-bodied adult and fully mentally capable. The Guest holding a "Special Guest" pass must always be present when using the passes at the permitted attractions.

Passes must be shown each time during access, always respecting the safety rules and instructions of our staff.

Preferential access passes are issued only upon evaluation of the appropriate certification and only at the Welcome Desk office, in presence of the following cases:
